Guest Instructor Mary Murray

Originally from Stirlingshire, Scotland, Mary Murray was introduced to Scottish Country Dancing in High School, and, as a member of the school team, participated in a few competitive SCD festivals in Central Scotland.



After graduating, she joined the Falkirk Branch of the RSCDS and, as a member of the demonstration group, participated in a few international music and dance festivals in various countries in Europe: Italy, Germany, Belgium and France. When she married, she moved to Edinburgh and danced with the Branch demonstration team there. Since arriving in Canada in the late 60's, Mary has been involved actively with the Vancouver Branch of the Society, teaching all levels of classes, directing the Branch demonstration group and also conducting numerous teacher candidate courses

for the Vancouver Branch. Over the past number of years, Mary has taught at numerous workshops and summer schools extensively throughout Canada and the U.S. Overseas "assignments" have included Australia, Denmark, France, Hawaii, Germany, Indonesia, Hong Kong, Japan, New Zealand, Singapore and the U.K. Mary has also enjoyed teaching at the annual RSCDS Summer School at St. Andrews, and the RSCDS Winter School in Pitlochry, Perthshire.

They have played for the Hawaii branch's Aloha Winter Weekend workshops since 2007, often with a featured guest artist (when the Humus also assume teaching duties), or as a quartet (when the workshop teacher is not a band member). The quartet returns to play in 2018. They love snorkeling, hiking, doing puzzles...and they're a heck of a lot of fun to dance to!
